## (Reverse of Resolution Form)

WHEREAS, absent accurate and complete information about the protections, rights and benefits contained in the New York State Constitution, many in the general public may be inclined to support these efforts; and

WHEREAS, the New York State Constitution protects the right to organize and collectively bargain (Article I, Section 17); and

WHEREAS, the New York State Constitution guarantees that the retirement benefits earned and accrued by public employees cannot be diminished (Article V, Section 7); and

WHEREAS, the New York State Constitution also :requires the state to provide for the maintenance and support of a system of free public schools where in all the children of the state may be educated (Article XI, Section 1); and prohibits the use of state monies to fund private/religious schools (Article XI, Section 3); and designates the 2.3 million acres of state owned land in the "Adirondack Park" as "forever wild" (Article XIV, Section 1); and clearly indicates the state's responsibility for aiding the needy, promoting the public health and caring for the physically- and mentally-challenged (Article XVII); and

WHEREAS, if a Constitutional Convention were convened, all of these and other rights, benefits and protections would be subject to change or repeal; therefore be it

RESOLVED, that NYSUT remain vigilant in opposing legislative efforts to convene a Constitutional Convention; and be it further

RESOLVED, that NYSUT continue to educate its members and the general public about the important rights, benefits and protections contained in the New York State Constitution, as well as the potential damaging effects that changes to those important provisions, or the outright repeal thereof, might cause.
