Full-Time and Part-Time Faculty, and Graduate Workers

Educators in more than a dozen full-time titles perform teaching, research, guidance and departmental service duties. Graduate Assistants work in teaching and non-teaching roles. Teaching adjuncts in four titles and educators in another 12 part-time titles teach or perform related duties, but are hired by CUNY colleges as contingent workers.

Professional Staff

Higher Education Officer Series employees (HEOs) perform planning, research, coordination, administrative and professional duties to support CUNY offices, programs and centers. They are full-time workers with many different functional titles. Non-Teaching Adjuncts (NTAs) do similar work on a part-time basis. College Laboratory Technicians (CLTs), working in full- and part-time titles, perform a wide variety of critical lab functions, creative pedagogical support roles, and technical duties.
